Eternal Righteousness Eternal forgiveness

Drawing the line:

Just where is it that HWM draws the line? The Prophetess whether true or false whose name is Celestial Revivalle has been making the rounds in the world of Youtube. She has stated that for TD Jakes probation has closed on account of his activities regarding the Millstone as well as membership with the M guys.

Jesus did warn about that and that may be the key in relation to the door of probation. The elder once stated that only Jesus can make determinative Judgements

Case in point King Manasseh:

Yet HWM God forgave Manasseh <u>2</u> <u>Chron 33:10-13</u> and it states that HWM doesn't change. Manasseh shed much innocent blood. He also practiced spiritualism. So, apparently Manasseh did a lot eviller than most people on planet earth. There appears to be a dichotomy between the life of his father King Hezekiah and the life of his son King Manasseh. Two totally opposing rulership's.

One was for HWM and the other totally opposed to HWM.

This dichotomy is very important on account of the fact that many in Rabbinic camp believe that **King Hezekiah** fulfilled the prophecy of the one sitting on the throne of David in Isaiah 9:6-7 since the prophecy states that the names of the Messiah are the following. **"Wonderful, Counsellor, Everlasting Father and Prince of Peace.**

So, the question is this: -

How could a King who was supposedly righteous by human standards fulfill such a prophecy considering that he made bad decisions such as showing the Babylonian contingent all the things that he had in his house such as the implements of gold and silver in relation to the vessels of the Lord etc.

He was later told by the Prophet that this would all be removed by the Babylonians.

Later Hezekiah became ill and cried like a baby to HWM for him to extend his life. So, here we see a prime example of human failure and weakness.

King Hezekiah could not in any way fulfill this prophecy since he was not an" Eternally existent being" like HWM.

If we are talking about dynastic inheritance, this would not fulfill the prophecy either since in his Eternal insight HWM wanted to put King Hezekiah to sleep on account of the fact that by extending his life for 15 more years his son King Manasseh would be born during that time frame.

The link above explains all the details as to why neither King Hezekiah nor his son Manasseh could fulfill this Messianic prophecy although they both sat on the throne of David their father - we are dealing with a very specific prophecy which relates to an Eternally existent being as previously mentioned, and King Manasseh could not be called a Prince of Peace since he brought much violence to Jerusalem and killed many innocent people keeping in mind that King Manasseh was the fruit of his father King Hezekiah as in son or sonship or as in passing down a legacy of righteousness from father to son.

This was not the case with **King Hezekiah**.

The Mind, its complexities its sufferings and sorrows its weakness its habits its genetics, its fantasies its failures its achievements, its ego, its rage its compassion, and its unreliable nature, its likes and dislikes, its intelligence its craftiness, foolishness its its and ultimately feeblemindedness its triumph in Christ.

All these things are taken into consideration in the determinative judgements of God who sees the end from the beginning.

Back to the so-called Prophetess:

Then again, she (Celeste) stated that HWM knows the mind of TD Jakes which to anyone with an understanding of how HWM deals with sin, this statement has a lot meaning since it can be interpreted that he won't change or that it's a fake repentance. No one knows this for sure, only HWM.

So, it becomes rather obvious that HWM knew the mind of Manasseh as well and the raging anger against HWM must have had some reason. Yet Manasseh truly repented <u>2Cor 33:10-13</u> and is used as an example of the forgiveness of HWM.

That type of forgiveness demands something that goes beyond mere forgiveness it's an <u>eternally righteous act</u> <u>of forgiveness</u> that demands a precision of judgement, not seen or experienced here on planet earth, since most humans would not be willing to forgive what Manasseh did and they would not be able to provide the reasons as to why such a sinner like this King, was forgiven.

Therefore, Eternal Righteousness presents Eternal Righteous Judgement and Forgiveness.

This is a critical aspect to the Everlasting Gospel, the seal of God and the purpose of why Revelation 13:8 features in the time of the Abomination of desolation. Few recognise the importance of Rev 13:8 – fact is, it is the most important facet of that chapter, bar none; no, not even the AC or the MoB that everyone is gas lit about.

Spiritualism – Manasseh and Saul

Notice that Manasseh practiced spiritualism, just as Saul did.

But apparently Saul's departure from the truth in relation to his stature as King of Israel bowing before the witch at Endor when supposedly summoning up Samuel was the breaking point.

The whole universe witnessed the act as did the good angels and the fallen ones were most probably rejoicing as well. This moment appeared to be a critical breaking point, since Saul was basically bowing down to the enemy before the whole Universe.

There is something in all these matters where HWM precisely decides with unerring exactitude why probation closes for certain individuals considering that the sin of Manasseh was not so much different than that of Saul.

PETER

Another case in point was the sin of Peter who denied Jesus 3 times before the Rooster crowed.

With Peter it was more obvious. "Fear" Prior to that his ego went all out in confessing Jesus prior to the hardship that was to be encountered during those final moments. Peter was brave at the commencement of the conflict when he whipped out his sword and cut the ear of the servant and Jesus then healed it and put it back in its place.

This was for all of them to see. Peter had religious zeal and ego. But when Peter encountered the accusations of a maid and two others claiming that he was one of Jesus followers this brave man of HWM coward in fear and caved in and even cursed in such a way as to give emphasis to his testimony that he was not one of Jesus followers.

After realizing what he had done he cried knowing that he had betrayed his Lord. But Jesus knew his heart and after His resurrection Jesus came to Peter while they were fishing.

⁵⁴ And they seized him, and led him *away*, and brought him into the high priest's house. But Peter followed afar off. ⁵⁵ And when they had kindled a fire in the midst of the court, and had sat down together, Peter sat in the midst of them. ⁵⁶ And a certain maid seeing him as he sat in the light *of the fire*, and looking stedfastly upon him, said, This man also was with him. ⁵⁷ But he denied, saying, Woman, I know him not.

⁵⁸ And after a little while another saw him, and said, Thou also art *one* of them. But Peter said, Man, I am not. ⁵⁹ And after the space of about one hour another confidently affirmed, saying, Of a truth this man also was with him; for he is a Galilaean. ⁶⁰ But Peter said, Man, I know not what thou sayest. And immediately, while he yet spake, the cock crew.

⁶¹ And the Lord turned, and looked upon Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how that he said unto him, Before the cock crow this day thou shalt deny me thrice.

⁶² And he went out, and wept bitterly.

Fact is that Jesus knew Peter and didn't want to lose him and the turning point that broke Peter down is seen in verse 61. That look of Jesus was instrumental in bringing Peter back, once his ego departed from him.

History states that he was crucified upside down since he didn't feel worthy of dying like his Lord.

That is why He is HWM. He can make those judgements.

In the case of Peter, it was that look even though Peter denied him. Previous to that Peter had confessed him. With Saul it didn't begin with the act at Endor. It was ego and probably began with his tall stature and the praise of others.

See 1st Samuel 9:2

² And he had a son, whose name was Saul, a ^[a]young man and a goodly: and there was not among the children of Israel a goodlier person than he: from his shoulders and upward he was higher than any of the people. It began with the disobedience of an order. He spared the King of the Amalekites and also kept the bounty.

The reader might ask - How does the writer of this SA know this matter about how the universe witnessed this act of betrayal?

The question rises which is the following

Does a certain time determine when God cuts off probation for a group a nation or a man or woman a church or a specific group = corpus= corporation?

Yes!

It appears to be determined by true and genuine repentance as taking place, or not taking place.

These things saith the Son of God, who hath his eyes like a flame of fire, and his feet are like unto burnished brass: ¹⁹ I know thy works, and thy love and faith and ministry and ^[k]patience, and that thy last works are more than the first. ²⁰ But I have *this* against thee, that thou sufferest ^[I]the woman Jezebel, who calleth herself a prophetess; and she teacheth and seduceth my ^[m]servants to commit fornication, and to eat things sacrificed to idols.

²¹ And I gave her time that she should repent; and she willeth not to repent of her fornication.

²² Behold, I cast her into a bed, and them that commit adultery with her into great tribulation, except they repent of ^[II]her works. ²³ And I will kill her children with ^[O]death; and all the churches shall know that I am he that searcheth the reins and hearts: and I will give unto each one of you according to your works. ²⁴ But to you I say, to the rest that are in Thyatira, as many as have not this teaching, who know not the deep things of Satan, as they are wont to say; I cast upon you none other burden.

With the nations it's been the prophecy of **Luke 21:24**. <u>Here</u>

The allotted probationary times of the nations translated from the word **"Kairoi** or kairos" is indicative of a certain limit or probationary time.

In the case of the nations of planet earth it began in 34AD and corporate probation ended in 1980 AD. With the individual probation remains open and also relates to the call of repentance and the importance of the seal of God.

Drawing the line.

³ I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish.

⁴Or those eighteen, upon whom the tower in Siloam fell, and slew them, think ye that they were sinners above all men that dwelt in Jerusalem?

⁵ I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish.

Comment:

Problem is that Jesus was telling this story for those who thought they were safe, when in fact there was no evidence that all those people are lost.

They suffered the immediate penalty of death, but they were no different from those whom Jesus was speaking to since they having heard Christ now had more responsibility than those who passed away.

It appears that the mindset of the people was that those people were all lost because of bad things that happened to them. The reader might recall that this was the same problem that Job's friends had with Job. They believed that he had done wrong and deserved those punishments.

So, what is the difference between that and people that have suffered all their lives? Bad things can happen to good people and the thinking that they were all sinners **is very** Roman Catholic. Yet, these ideas exist in Laodicea.

There was an individual and she has suffered from a permanent migraine headache all of her life. That the migraine was result of unrepented sin. The population of that era was very Roman Catholic as evidenced by the effects of works righteousness since the teachers were the very epitome of works righteousness and this was passed down as the traditions of the learned elders.

Case in point in the Philippines there is a saying Balet se puet. Puet has to do with a person's posterior and may be tied into having bad luck. When visiting the Philippines, an individual encountered a whole bunch of obstacles and the driver of the vehicle was concerned that all the problems had to do with the visitor. Well of course! The visitor took Pamphlets of Luke 21:24 over there and an SDA lady distributed them. At least she stated that she would.

Another case in point **Ananias** and **Safira**.

It states that they lied to the Holy Spirit but is this Blasphemy of the Holy Spirit? If it was, they were unaware or did it by ignorance. Yet they paid the price which was immediate death, yet there isn't proof that they are forever lost.

Judgement was already rendered.

They might have another opportunity at the resurrection. Another case in point is **Uzzah** who touched the Ark of the Covenant and was struck down. This doesn't necessarily mean that he is lost.
